ACADEMIC SUPPORTS

Tutoring

The Den Teachers are available for tutoring in Math, English, Science, and Special Education every Mon., Tues., and Thurs. after school in the MUR until 5:30pm.

Quiet Study The library is available for quiet study time Monday-Thursday from 3:30-5:30pm.

Peer Tutoring Trained peer tutors are available in the Den or for ongoing individual tutoring.

Credit Recovery

Summer School Available on an as-needed basis, determined each year by district credit limits.

Cyber High Online credit recovery programs for students who have earned D's or F's in required courses.

Community College Concurrent enrollment classes available for free to WHS students at local community colleges.

Adult School Concurrent enrollment classes available for free to WHS students at the SUHSD Adult School.

Academic Advancement

Summer Math Acceleration Courses available over the summer on campus for students to advance through Geometry over the summer. Available by application.

AP Calculus Bootcamp Advanced summer program for students entering AP Calculus A/B.

ASAP Bootcamp Summer transition program for students enrolling in advanced classes for the first time.

College Preparation

AVID College-Prep program and courses. Students apply for AVID during 8th grade.

BUILD A skill-building after school program (and 9th grade class), available to students who apply during 8th grade.

Albert.io SAT, ACT, and AP test preparation available online for free.

Academies

Small Learning Communities. Students apply during 9th grade for 10th-12th grades.

Academy For students interested in courses and careers in computers and business.

Green Academy For students interested in environmental and conservation issues.

Transition to High School

Compass Summer transition and remediation program for incoming students preselected based on academic need.

Team Ascent A skill-building program with mentoring that meets during the summer in the afternoons after Compass.

Elevate [Math] Summer math program available for 9th grade students.

Aspirations Advocates Two WHS staff members provide mentoring for 9th and 10th grade students identified as academically at-risk and prepare them for academic success.

Boys & Girls Club Program A BGCP case manager provides academic coaching for 9th grade students and connects students with programs at Boys & Girls Club.



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Response to Intervention

A model for providing intervention and services for students in need of Academic, Behavioral, or Personal/Social support

Referral

Teacher or Counselor identifies student in need of intervention.

Intervention Response Team (IRT) Counselor presents case and Interventions are discussed with the IRT. The IRT consists of guidance counselors, AVPs, the School Psychologist, and the Bilingual Resource Teacher.

Intervention Support Counselor assists student and/or family to access available academic, behavioral, or personal/social supports.

Monitoring Counselor monitors student achievement and well being and refers for additional intervention, as necessary.

If no learning discrepancy is found, the SST team will continue to monitor and refer for additional intervention, as necessary. **Student Success Team** *If further intervention is needed,* an SST is convened with the student, parent, and teachers.

Assessment If further intervention is needed, a student may be referred for educational assessment. Assessment results may indicate a need for a 504, IEP (Special Education), or continuation of SST recommendations.

504 Plan A general education plan for students with a documented disability, but who may not qualify for an IEP.

Special Education

(IEP) A plan of services available to those with an assessed learning discrepancy.
