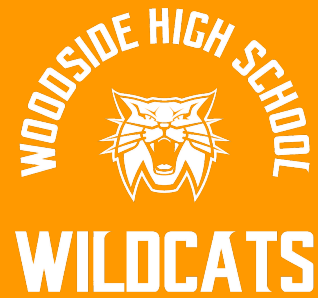

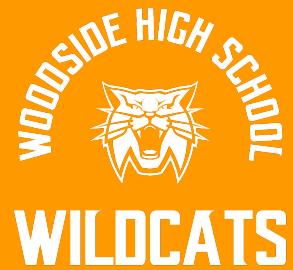

Students will have access to change courses in Infinite Campus from **January 19th - February 13th**

11th Graders: February 14th - March 11th

10th Graders: March 19th - March 26th

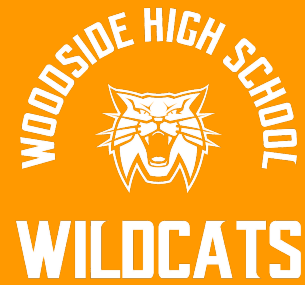
9th Graders: March 27th - April 3rd

After the Counselor meets with your student, the counselor will confirm courses and send an email with your student's courses including summer school.

Changes can be requested via a Google Form through April 26.

The **Online Information Update (OIU)** will be the last chance to request changes. Open **May 1 - May 26**. Parents will be required to confirm courses.

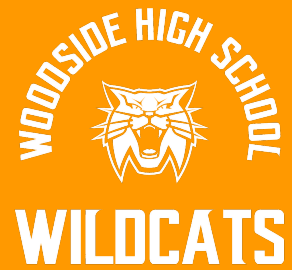

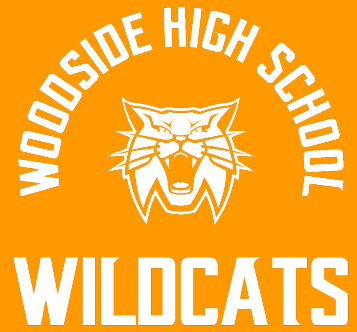
Things to be aware of...



- Courses will be changed automatically with completion of a **WHS summer school course.**
- Students should **enroll in PE** unless they are absolutely passionate about a sport and plan on playing all four years or 3 seasons of a sport after 9th grade.
- 9-11th graders need to be enrolled in a **minimum six courses.** 12th graders need to be enrolled in a minimum of **five courses.**

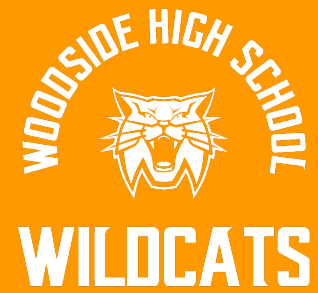

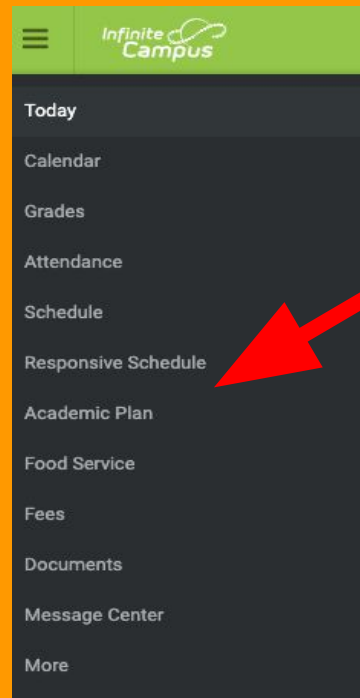
Step 1

Go to portal.seq.org and log in with your **student ID** and **Canvas password** (initials and date of birth).



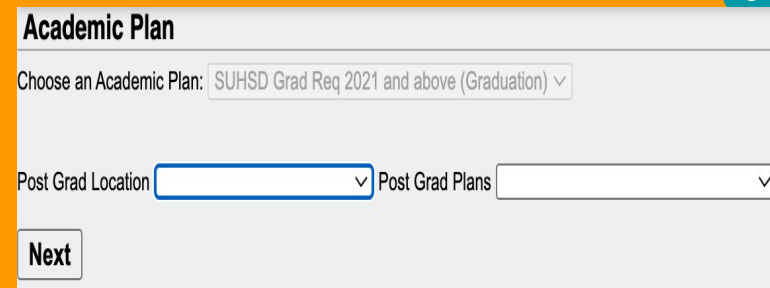
Step 2
