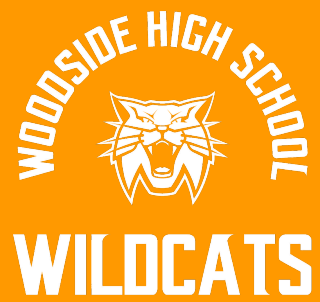

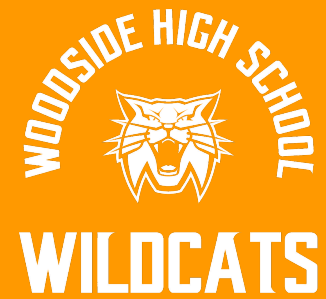
# Cosas que deben tener en cuenta ...
